A prime responsibility of the Board is its obligation to implement the HOA Covenant for the benefit of all Homeowners. As such, there are a number of key issues that need to be addressed. Overdue and delinguent HOA dues are a serious issue and very disappointing given that Deloaks has one of the lowest HOA dues of all subdivisions in our area. As of March 2019, the total amount of dues that are in arears equals \$10,713. Homeowners who are in arears are asked to address this as a matter of priority or to approach the Board if there are extenuating circumstances that preclude you from settling these overdue balances and for which additional time may be requested. Failure to do so could result in legal action being taken by the Board consistent with the HOA covenant. As a reminder, it is very simple to set up a recurring payment through your bank to pay your quarterly HOA dues if you have trouble remembering to do so.

Boats, utility trailers, ATVs, dumpsters etc. parked in driveways for a long term is also an issue that needs to be addressed. Please be reminded that these items must be parked behind the front line of your home and out of sight. In fairness, many newer Deloaks residents may not be aware of this restriction and we kindly ask all Deloaks residents to comply with this requirement in order to keep our neighborhood looking nice.

We ask that residents be diligent in keeping the boat launch gate locked after using it. It is not allowed to park your trailer there and ask the resident whose trailer is parked there to kindly remove it.

The Board has contacted the St. Tammany Engineering Department to survey the drainage ditches and clean out those that require it. Current plans are to muck a short section the ditch along the north side of Elmwood Loop near the boat launch where water stands. This work should be undertaken soon.

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
